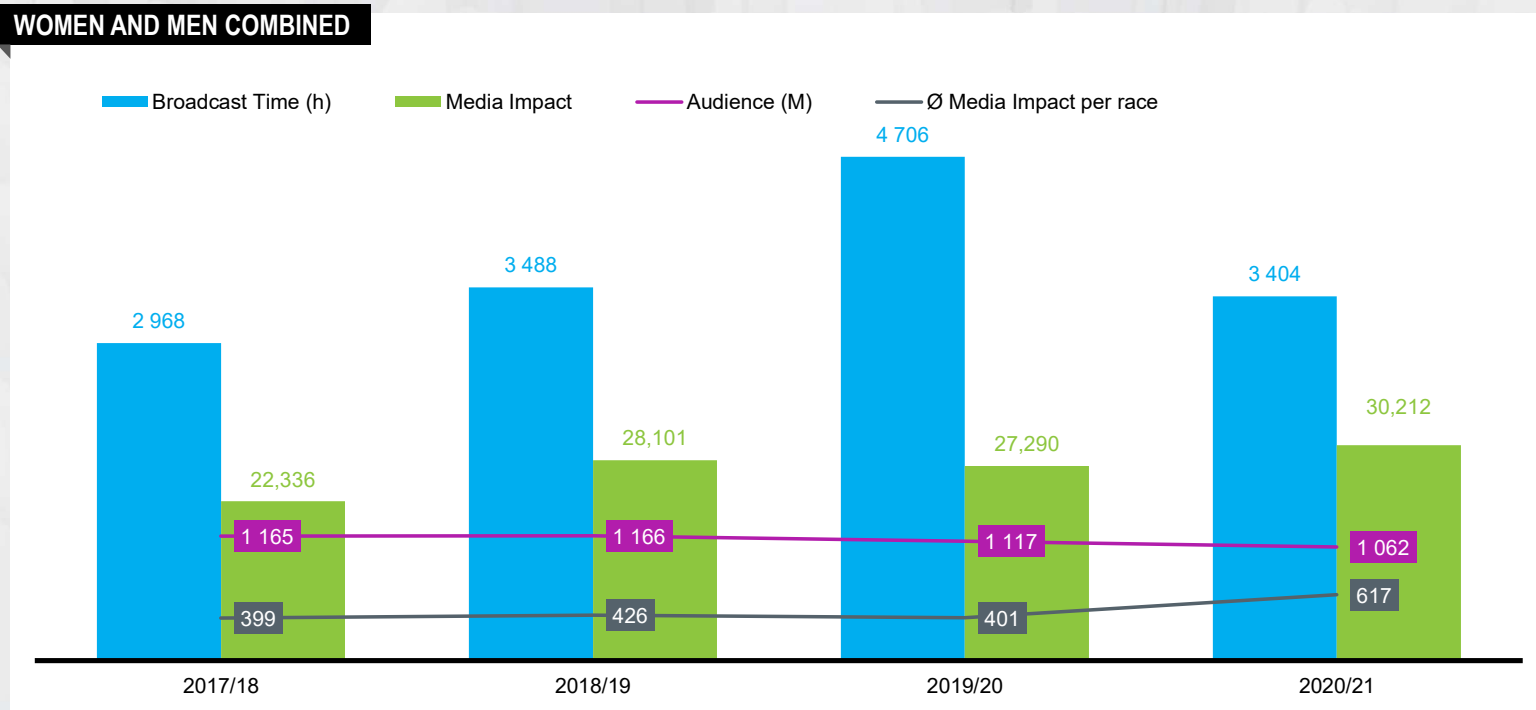
- BUT don't forget that

# CROSS COUNTRY: SEASON COMPARISON

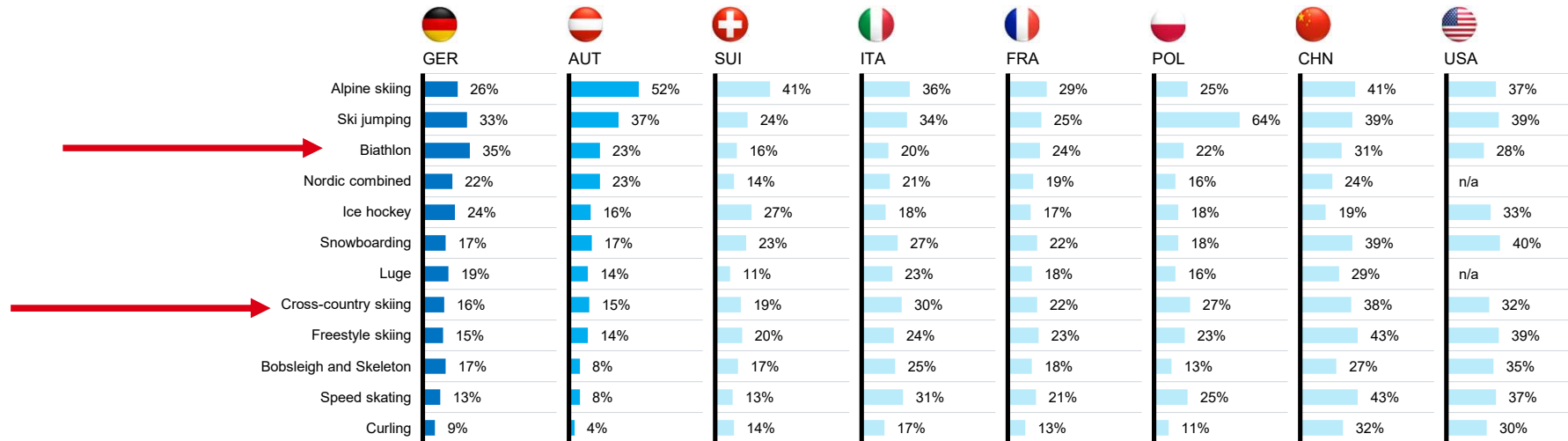

Driven by enthusiasm for successful athletes and traditional events, Alpine skiing and Ski jumping are the most popular disciplines in winter sports. Some sports – such as Biathlon in Germany or Freestyle in China – have a market-specific significance.

## KEY TAKEAWAYS



- » Broadcast Time remains constant, media impact increases (+16%)
- » Positive trend especially in Switzerland (+17%), Slovakia (+107%), Czech Republic (+257%) and Croatia (+50%)
- » Number of races remains fairly stable, but average media impact per race increases (+8%)



- » Broadcast time declines (-14%) - less coverage on Eurosport
- » Media impact remains stable (+1%) with constant development in Poland (+1%) and Germany (+2%)
- » Positive trends in Russia (+18%), Norway (+13%) and Slovenia (+17%)



- » Broadcast time declines (-28%) - less coverage on Eurosport
- » Media impact increases (+11%)
- » Russia drives this development (+612%) with extensive coverage on FTA channel Match TV



- » Broadcast time (+1%) and media impact (-3%) remain stable
- » Media impact trend in Germany remains negative (-13%)
- » Positive developments in Finland (+22%), Austria (+5%) and Japan (+584%)



- » Broadcast time (-8%) and media impact (-30%) are declining
- » China, traditionally the most important market, sees a 57% decrease
- » Positive trends in Switzerland (+62%) and Finland (+166%)

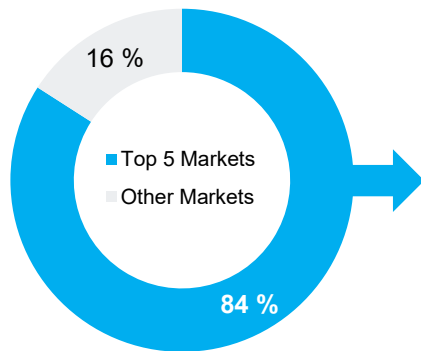


- » Broadcast time (-44%) and media impact (-35%) are declining
- » China, traditionally the most important market, sees a 67% decrease
- » Positive trends in Germany (+17%), Austria (+92%) and Slovenia (+153%)

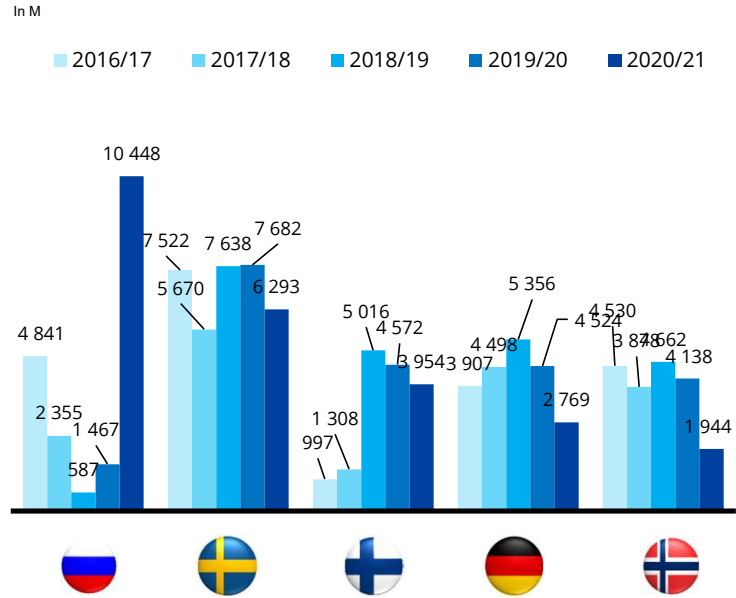
# TOP MARKETS 2020/21 BY MEDIA IMPACT

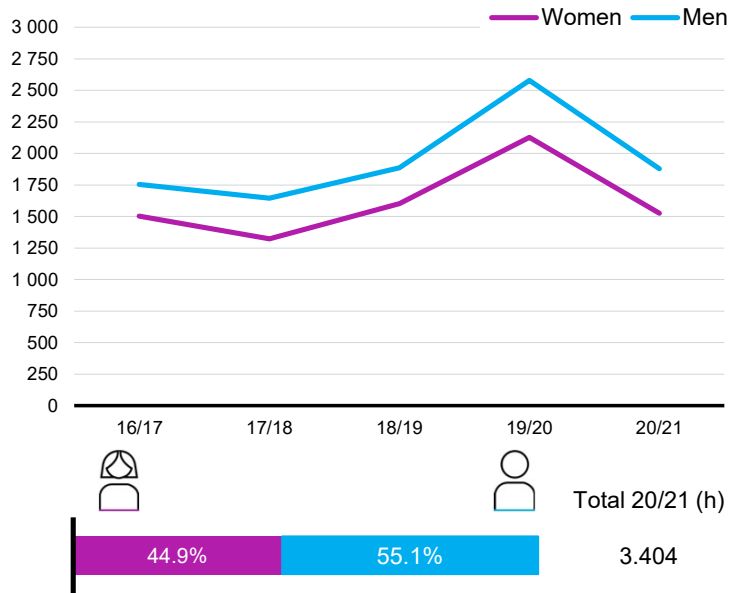


# CROSS COUNTRY: SEASON COMPARISON

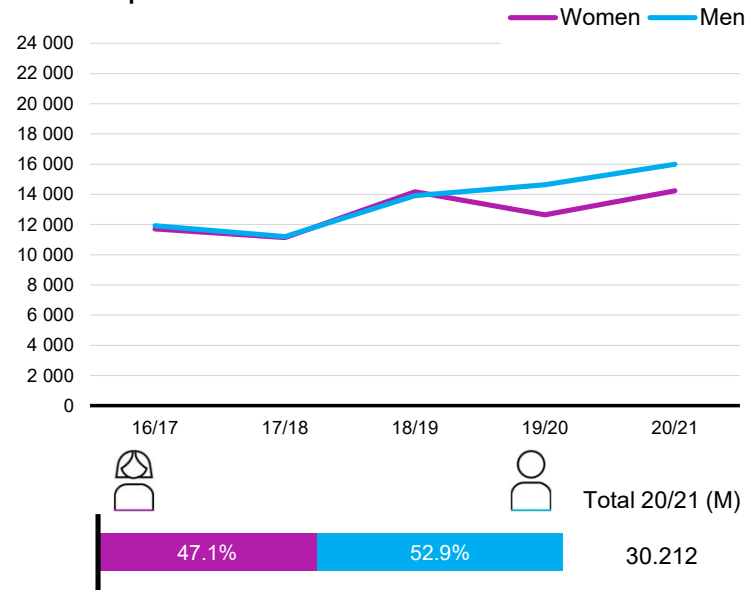

## Fluor

- Apparatet ferdig- sendt til uavhengig ILS test
- Anbefaler praktiske tester neste vinter
- Neste år gjelder EU regelverket:
  - C6 fluor lov å bruke
  - C8 ikke lov å bruke

The current *REGULATION (EU) 2019/1021* „POP-regulation“ states that it is forbidden to manufacture, sell **and use** products containing C8 fluorocarbons/PFOA. This applies also for products that were produced before 04.07.2020.

**New Rule: It is forbidden to possess, apply, use, sell, give-out or trade any products containing C8 fluorocarbons/PFOA\* at all FIS events.**

*(This will be implemented in the FIS Event and Competition Rules incl. Annex A in due time and in effect from the season start 2021/22 onwards)*
